Reward Offered to Capture illegal Dumper Threatening District's Sewer System!

St. Vrain Sanitation District authorities are calling on the community to remain vigilant and report any suspicious activity related to illegal dumping in the sewer system. Any tips that lead to the identification and prosecution of the offending dumper will be eligible to receive the reward. The \$3,000 reward is intended to incentivize individuals to come forward with information leading to the apprehension of the illegal dumper. District Manager Rob Fleck stated, "We must protect our wastewater treatment plant and maintain the integrity of our Districts water resources. We encourage the public to help us in this critical endeavor. If you see something, say something."

Residents and businesses are reminded to dispose of waste responsibly through approved methods, such as recycling programs and hazardous waste disposal centers. Proper waste disposal not only safeguards the environment and public health but also helps maintain the efficient operation of essential infrastructure like the biological wastewater treatment plant.

Tampering with Manholes or Pumper Trucks:

If you witness anyone attempting to open or tamper with sewer manholes or pumper trucks dumping into manholes. Take a photo and report it immediately.



Anyone with information regarding the illegal dumper is urged to contact the local police or the Districts **emergency line at 303-994-7572**. Let's work together to preserve the District's water resources and ensure a clean and safe environment for all.



Last Chance to Save! Annual Payment Option

With your January 2024 billing, you have the option to pay for one year of sewer service during the first quarter and receive one month free. This has been offered by the District for several years and, unfortunately this will be the last time it is offered. Account must be current to qualify. The drainage fee is not discounted. Instructions and amount for participating in the annual sewer payment fee are listed on your January statement. Commercial and Industrial customers will need to contact the District to obtain the annual payment rate.

Moving forward there are still several reasons to pay annually, which will remain an option. Paying bills annually reduces the frequency of transactions, saving you time and effort. You won't need to remember to make payments every quarter, and you're less likely to incur late fees if you forget.

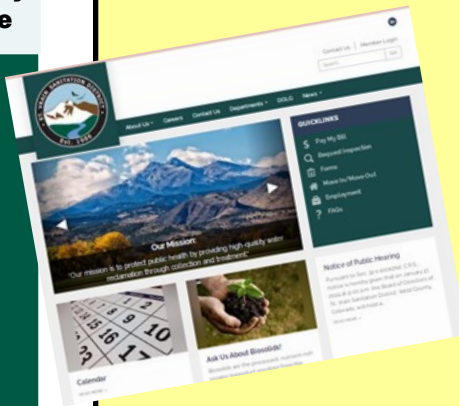

Plant Upgrade Report:

Here at St. Vrain Sanitation District, we aim to protect public health by providing high-quality water reclamation through strategic and innovative treatment approaches. As such, we have reduced the phosphorus and nitrogen content in the effluent dramatically since the completion of our plant expansion, which wrapped up in March of 2023. One of our goals as a District has been to reduce the phosphorus levels to less than 0.7 mg/l (milligram per liter) and nitrogen (TIN less than 7mg/l), which we have successfully done, per our plant design, all within three months of start-up.



One major aspect of St. Vrain's success lies within the optimization of the new screw presses, which converts the waste solids into a stable and beneficial organic material called Biosolids. (Biosolids are nutrient-rich fertilizers and soil amendments that are used to improve and maintain productive soils and stimulate plant growth.) With the fine-tuning and efficiency of these screw presses, the District is maximizing its ability to extract phosphorus from the process, and this is only the beginning. The District Staff's efforts have proven so effective that we have even eliminated the need for coagulants in the treatment process, which enhances the District's sustainability and treatment. St. Vrain Sanitation District strives to provide the highest standards in water quality reclamation, public health, and safety and will continue to do so in the future.
